MAKE-UP POLICY

If an Hour Examination is missed, Dr. Khachik must be contacted as soon as possible.

Regarding absences, University policy states: A make-up examination, when permitted, must be given on Campus, unless the published schedule and course description require other arrangements. The make-up examination must be at a time and place mutually agreeable to the instructor and student, cover only the material for which the student was originally responsible, and be given with a time limit that retains currency of the material. The make-up must not interfere with the student's regularly schedule classes. - 1.
